

The World returns to Canada with Pacific coast voyage in 2026

The World, Residences at Sea, will return to Canada in June and July 2026, dedicating four weeks to British Columbia with immersive itineraries across eight destinations along the Pacific coastline.

The World, Residences at Sea announced its return to Canada in June and July 2026, with a four-week itinerary focused on British Columbia's Pacific coastline. The residential mega yacht will visit eight destinations, offering an in-depth exploration of the region's cities, islands, and natural landscapes.



The programme spans the Southern Gulf Islands to the remote Northern Coast, highlighting British Columbia's diverse geography, including mountain ranges, temperate rainforests, coastal inlets, and wildlife habitats. The Canadian voyage forms part of the ship's broader 2026 global itinerary, which includes 90 destinations across 20 countries on six continents.

"There is something profoundly inspiring about Canada's Pacific coast," said **Jessica Hoppe**, President & CEO of The World. *"It's scale, serenity, and cultural richness create an extraordinary canvas for exploration. With a strong community of Canadian Resident Owners, our return reflects both their deep appreciation for this remarkable region and our continued commitment to delivering transformative experiences in the world's most captivating destinations."*



Among the highlighted destinations, Victoria offers curated experiences combining heritage, ecology, and science. Residents will have access to a guided programme including visits to Hatley Park, Abkhazi Gardens, Government House, and Craigdarroch Castle, alongside a private ocean sciences briefing at leading marine research centres.

In Prince Rupert, the itinerary focuses on Indigenous culture and wilderness access, with experiences including a city exploration by vintage trolley, visits to Seal Cove Salt Marsh, and journeys through the Great Bear Rainforest. Cultural programming includes "Echoes of Time," tracing Tsimshian history through immersive activities and museum visits.

Salt Spring Island provides a nature-led programme centred on its artisanal identity and coastal ecosystems. Activities include bioluminescent kayaking, forest exploration with ecological specialists, and curated cultural and culinary experiences overlooking Ganges Harbour.



The World operates as a privately owned residential vessel, where residents travel to approximately 100 ports annually while living onboard. The onboard offering includes multiple dining venues, a wine programme featuring more than 1,100 selections, a 15,000-bottle cellar, wellness and fitness facilities, a spa, pools, a theatre, and a full-size tennis court. The ship also offers curated destination experiences supported by a dedicated concierge service.

Additional highlights from the 2026 itinerary include an Antarctic semi-circumnavigation expedition, featuring navigation through ice-filled waters and visits to remote regions such as the Ross Sea. The programme also includes calls to Bora Bora, with lagoon and reef-based activities, and Tokyo, where residents will participate in a cultural immersion programme combining onshore experiences with onboard programming.
